Weathering the Storm

A drypoint print is produced by drawing directly onto a printmaking plate using a steel needle. Nicola Slattery usually uses a perspex plate - a technique she has helped to pioneer and which is now used by many other printmakers. The number of prints in each edition is strictly limited - usually to between 6 and 12. Many of her prints are hand coloured using water colour. All are hand produced at each stage directly by the artist herself and therefore each print is unique. The prints are signed and numbered by the artist upon completion.
